THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Greetings and happy summer to all!

Our Corpus Christi procession last weekend was a great success; what a wonderful public witness to our faith in the Eucharistic! Thank you to all who made it possible, especially Curtis St. Pierre for obtaining the permits and police details, the choir, and all who assisted during the procession itself. It is my hope that this can be an annual occurrence. Perhaps we can go an extra few blocks next year!

At the Harvard Catholic Center, we partner with the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) who provides us with a team of four missionaries to direct our discipleship formation and outreach for undergraduates. These missionaries are recent college graduates from across the country who commit 2-3 years after graduation to serve at college campus ministries. Since our partnership began with FOCUS 9 years ago, we've had about a dozen graduates go on to become missionaries themselves at other campuses. Last week I was able to make my annual trip down to Ave Maria University in Florida to meet our new team during their summer training. We will have three new missionaries and one returning from last year. I'm really excited to be working with them and I am confident they will continue to help us expand our outreach to students on campus and share the Gospel. You may not realize they are here during the year, as they tend to blend in with the rest of the students, but they spend many hours each week making personal invitations to students, as well as in one-on-one formation and leading our small group Bible studies. I'm sure you'll enjoy meeting Grace, Gabbi, Nick, and Miles when they move into the area later in July!

LIVE THE LITURGY INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

God calls us in the midst of ordinary things. Often only looking for God in the dramatic, spectacular, the ritual or the sacred places, we miss that He is walking beside us. Every moment of every day, in every circumstance and experience, God is calling to us, "Follow me." Sometimes, we are too distracted to hear this call. Other times, we would rather ignore it or pretend it wasn't heard. God, however, is very persistent. Whether we fine tune our hearing to receive this invitation now or when we close our eyes in death, we need to make a choice. The choice involves leaving some things behind and moving forward, taking risks. Choosing to keep focused and single-minded, the lens we then use to see our world and one another is God's, not our own. Life is no longer about what is important or matters to me but what matters to God. We acquire a new filter and are asked to use that filter to make choices, establish priorities, and determine what direction we will take, and how to love. Once we accept God's invitation, we cannot keep looking back to what was left behind, only forward to the surprises yet to come.

FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry has an urgent need for **paper grocery bags**. If you have been collecting them, this would be an ideal time to bring them to the church. The supply of cereal is low so donations of **cold cereal, instant oatmeal, and canisters of oatmeal would be very helpful**. Other priority items include **salad dressing, mayonnaise, granola bars, pasta sauce, dried fruit, and jelly or jam**.
