## SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

#### Dear Friends,

I encourage you to see the **sheet that has been made available** in the vestibule and online. It outlines the many opportunities for Lenten practices here at St. Paul's. This week offers several ways to go deeper during this Lenten season. First off, there is daily Mass; even if you make it only once or twice a week, you'll be amazed how God can work with that time when you give it to Him.

Wednesday holds the first of our Community Lunches with and for the Homeless. You are welcome to support it by helping with brining food, set up, clean up, serving, and taking time to sit and chat with our guests. The meal is in the lower church after the noon Mass, but preparations begin well before that. On Wednesday evening, the opportunity for Confession will be available in the church from 6:30pm-8:00pm. Come, and let the Lord speak to your heart with mercy!

Thursday evening, March 9, from 5:30pm-6:15pm, we have the kind of event that is unique to St. Paul's. The magnificent Pergolesi Stabat Mater will be sung by our Choir of Men and Boys, preceded by a brief spiritual reflection offered by Harvard undergraduate Mairead Baker. It is a time for Lenten meditation not to be missed. You can make an evening of it and then head over the Harvard Catholic Center at 7:00pm for a discussion with Law Professor Elizabeth Papp Kamali about her Catholic faith. Light refreshments will be served.

Almsgiving is an important component of Lent. I am very grateful to the 90 people (though I had hoped for more!) who donated to our Parish Grand Annual. I am happy to report that we have exceeded our goal of \$85,000. We will give an updated total soon, and folks are still encouraged to contribute as they are able. I am so very grateful for your generosity and for the breathing space this gives us with so many projects and programs on our plate.

Along the almsgiving line, we are also announcing this week the **Catholic Appeal**. During Mass next week, after the homily, we will have the opportunity to make a pledge to support Cardinal Seán and his mission in overseeing the administrative and pastoral needs of our big Archdiocese. Please prayerfully consider how you might participate. I have already made a personal donation of \$400.00.

Our **Parish Baby Shower** continues this weekend. We are grateful for any contributions you can make, which we will bring to Pregnancy Center overseen by the Boston Archdiocese.

You might also consider obtaining a copy of our **Choir School's most recent CD, entitled** *Requiem*. Its meditative and magnificent music by Gabriel Faure, as well as by our own Music Director James Kennerley, will be sure to inspire you during this holy season. Copies are available through the Parish Office, the Choir School website, and all major platforms.

Come, let us return to the Lord! Be courageous and bold this Lent.

#### FOOD PANTRY

As we begin Lent, parishioners may want to donate to the food pantry as part of your almsgiving. While our shelves are overflowing with pasta and canned beans, other items are in high demand. Now that our inexpensive source of shelf stable milk is no longer available, we have an **urgent need for quart-size containers of milk (Parmalat, Natrel, or similar)**. Other items that would be particularly helpful at this time include **canned peaches and pears, coffee, mayonnaise, jelly, salad dressing, crackers, granola bars/cereal bars, peanuts, canisters of plain oatmeal, cooking oil, and flour**. However, all items are welcome as a greater selection allows us to accommodate different dietary needs and cultural preferences.
