THE HOLY EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

Dear Friends,

Once again, a blessed New Year to you all. This weekend we celebrate the beautiful Feast of Epiphany, often referred to as "Little Christmas." The Christmas season officially concludes this Monday, with the Baptism of the Lord. It is always good to shape our days and weeks around the liturgical days of fasting and feasting, so be sure to feast during these final days of Christmas!

I am grateful to Harvard College senior LyLena Estabine who has offered to oversee a parish collection of infant and baby items for those most in need in the Boston area. This will continue throughout January, and there will be a donation box in the vestibule area. More information is available in the bulletin and on the parish website.

I'd like to give an update about the boiler that heats the Parish Center, Choir School, Harvard Catholic Center and the rectory. After three weeks with no heat, the replacement was installed and made functional on December 21. I want to thank those who donated space heaters to us, which were so very much appreciated. I also want to thank those who stepped forward with donations towards the \$150,000 cost of the new system. Through their kindness, we will be able to pay for this unexpected expense without putting the parish into debt. This building needs lots of upkeep and is central to our ministry at St. Paul's, and so I am so grateful to those who allow us to care for it.

I would like to encourage you to join the Harvard Catholic Forum's presentation, Saturday, January 13 from 10:15-12:00 noon, entitled: "The Post-Dobbs Landscape, medical and Legal Dimensions." Walk ins are welcome but registration is requested to better prepare for seating and refreshments. See the website or flyers.

I'd also like to give an update about the Parish Grand Annual collection. We are hoping that, with the holidays behind us, those who have not yet joined in this effort will be able to do so. 67 pledges have been received. Could you help us to meet our goal of 400 parishioners participating? For our parish to stay solvent and afloat (not including recent extraordinary costs), I am asking every individual or household to pledge/donate \$400; this can be paid in installments over the next three or four months. 400 participants/\$400; easy to remember and certainly an attainable goal! FOOD PANTRY

A survey of Cambridge food pantry clients in multiple languages found that **cooking oil and spices** (especially **cinnamon**) were among the most desired items. We value this feedback as we strive to have items that meet the dietary needs and cultural preferences of those who come to us. We are also trying to replenish our supply of **tea** (all varieties welcome) and **heartly soups** (**Progresso, Campbell's Chunky, or similar**) as the temperature drops. Other needs include **jelly or jam, canned fruit in juice, granola bars, nuts, crackers, and coffee**. Finally, if you received a holiday gift basket with some items that you don't plan to eat, please consider donating anything that you won't use - and enjoy the rest.

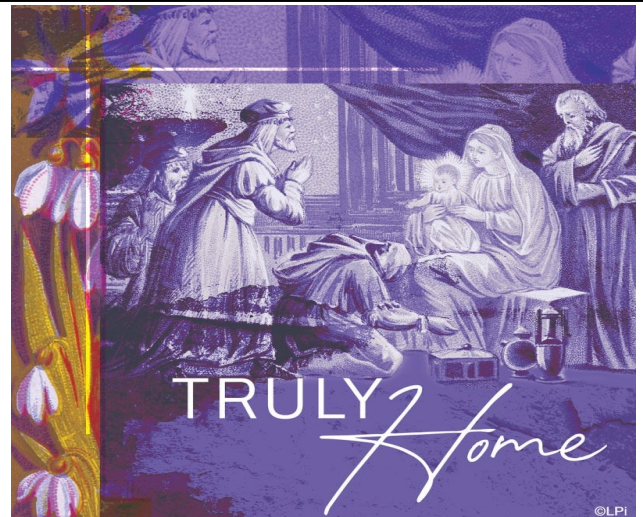
