**CORI RENEWAL TIME &
PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN**

Per the Archdiocese of Boston, as part of serving in **ANY** ministry at St. Paul's, or any parish in the Archdiocese, Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) checks are obtained for all volunteers who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly or the disabled. CORI checks with a valid ID will take place before you start practicing your ministry. Recently, we learned that all volunteers are also required to **read and sign a Code of Ministerial Behavior and complete a VIRTUS, Protecting God's Children, training class**. We, at St. Paul Parish are pleased to once again be able to have our annual second collection to support our Sister Parish, Our Lady of Fatima in Beit Sahour, Palestine. Fr. Issa Hijazeen, Pastor of Our Lady of Fatima, wrote that his focus this year is on the Scouts of the parish. For the first time in the history of the parish they are forming a marching band for the young people to learn to play brass instruments. Boys and girl Scouts are a vibrant part of all the churches in the Holy Land. The parade of marching bands from town to town is a spectacular event on the day of the Easter Vigil as they anticipate the arrival of the Easter Candle lit from the Holy Fire at the Church of the Holy Sepulchre, site of the Resurrection, and brought to the churches in the West Bank. Fr.
