

FOOD PANTRY

As the extra benefits that helped families through the pandemic come to an end, the number of people visiting the food pantry each week is increasing. In fact, we plan to shorten our hours because we are routinely running out of fresh produce and other perishable items after the first hour. If you would like to help keep our shelves stocked, we need boxed shelf-stable milk (both dairy and non-dairy alternatives), pasta sauce, peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned and dried fruit, nuts, crackers, granola bars, rice, solid white tuna, tea, and coffee. Guests select only two items from the pantry each week so we know that donations from parishioners go to individuals and families who will use them. The paper grocery bags that we receive from parishioners also help tremendously as we need about 100 bags every week and they are too expensive to purchase.
