SPECIAL SECOND COLLECTION: JUNE 8/9 RELIEF EFFORTS FOR CATASTROPHIC FLOODS IN BRAZIL

Cardinal Seán has asked all parishes in the Archdiocese to take a up a second collection for the people of Brazil who are suffering from catastrophic floods. More than 600,000 people have been displaced from their homes with 450 cities impacted. Many people are missing and the death toll is now approaching 150 people. Collected funds will be given to Catholic Relief Services who will work with agencies in Brazil. The family of a parishioner recently received into the Church here at the Easter Vigil lives in one of the towns devastated by these floods. Let us help our brothers and sisters in need. Thank you.

FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry has shifted to a client choice model for distributing bread and desserts. As a result, we no longer need paper bags. Our shelves are well-stocked overall thanks to parishioners and others in the community. Some items that would be particularly helpful at this time are **mayonnaise, mustard, pancake mix (complete preferred), popcorn (bagged or microwave), shelf stable milk, nuts, trail mix, Indian meal pouches (madras lentils, etc.), tea (black and herbal) and coffee.** We have also had a lot of requests for **corn flakes and other low sugar cereals (we have plenty of plain Cheerios).**
