## EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

If you recall, the "great flood" of the St. Paul's Parish Center this past spring happened on Divine Mercy Sunday at... yes, it's true... exactly 3:00pm: the Hour of Mercy at which Jesus promises "divine floodgates" of mercy to be thrown open. Coincidence, you ask? I say absolutely not! There were indeed many observable graces that day judging by the 75 people who came to confession, many for the first time in a year and even many years. But I firmly believe that there were many hidden graces of that day, graces whose fruit is still yet to be seen.

I hope that this upcoming academic year with the full return of Harvard students will begin to shed light on this mysterious occurrence. The undergraduate community saw unexpected growth last year with the limited number of students on campus. There are actually two students in particular who converted to Catholicism on their own at home over the past 2 years! It's stories like these that have created a unique buzz of excitement among the students to be back on campus and to finally meet all of these friends they've made over Zoom the past 18 months.

On a perhaps more superficial note, but significant nonetheless, the Parish Center and Harvard Catholic Center are receiving a nice facelift from all of the post-flood repairs: cleaned and replaced carpets, new paint color schemes, rearranged and reorganized offices. All of this actually gives me a sense of starting fresh as we (please God) emerge from the pandemic. Having 3 years under my belt now at St. Paul's, I feel very much settled here and look forward to all that is to come.

For now I'm enjoying relatively quiet weekends and Tuesday evenings before they will be filled with student activities late into the evening. We look forward to welcoming new freshmen and welcoming back returning students who will gradually move on campus beginning August 20.

### UPGRADES TO CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM AND VIDEO CONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY

Over the past year, the clarity of spoken word through our sound system has unfortunately decreased due to two external factors. First, the refinishing of the plasterwork in the sanctuary added a full second (!) of reverb to the space. And second, some of the internal audio settings were thrown off for the sake of optimizing the audio for live-streaming during Holy Week, when many parishioners still remained at home. We would therefore like to invest in recalibrating the system and doing some minor upgrades. Most notably, the upgrades will involve replacing the 30+ year-old speakers in the sanctuary as well as in the choir loft. Doing this will allow for greater clarity without having to increase the volume, which results in feedback and the "boomy" cavernous effect. The main speakers throughout the nave still work well, but will be recalibrated in order to adapt to the increased reverb.

And finally, we hope to purchase a device that will allow for seamless video conferencing for groups in our Boles Conference Room. With this all-in-one camera, microphone and speaker that connect to the TV, meetings that include a hybrid of in-person and virtual attendance will be able to run much more smoothly.

**The total cost for all of these upgrades is \$3,200.
