Dear Friends,

Lent can sometimes feel like an antiseptic on a wound; it certainly stings and hurts, but there is an evidential reality that when applied generously, healing begins. With Ash Wednesday just behind us, there is an entire season ahead. Dispose yourself to the Lord by choosing to remove those things that take your energy, time, and attention away from Him. Be courageous and bold this Lent.

I encourage you to see the sheet that was made available last week and can still be found in the vestibule and online. It outlines the many opportunities for Lenten practices here at St. Paul's. Some highlights are the Parish Baby Shower (beginning this week), Lenten Community Lunches for the Homeless and friends, extra confession times and other prayers. The Pergolesi Stabat Mater on March 9, sung by our Choir of Men and Boys with a spiritual reflection offered by one of our Harvard undergrads, is also not be missed. And let me make a plug for attending weekday Mass, even if only once or twice a week; you'll be amazed how God can work with that time when you give it to Him.

Almsgiving is an important component of Lent. We have our Food Pantry, as well as electronic giving to support the parish, extra collections for those in need, the Parish Grand Annual, and the upcoming Archdiocesan Catholic Appeal. Ask the Lord which way is best for you. You might also consider obtaining a copy of our Choir School's most recent CD, entitled Requiem. Its meditative and magnificent music by Gabriel Faure, as well as by our own Music Director James Kennerley, will be sure to inspire you during this holy season. FOOD PANTRY

As we begin Lent, parishioners may want to donate to the food pantry as part of your almsgiving. While our shelves are overflowing with pasta and canned beans, other items are in high demand. Now that our inexpensive source of shelf stable milk is no longer available, we have an urgent need for quart-size containers of milk (Parmalat, Natrel, or similar). Other items that would be particularly helpful at this time include canned peaches and pears, coffee, mayonnaise, jelly, salad dressing, crackers, granola bars/cereal bars, peanuts, canisters of plain oatmeal, cooking oil, and flour. However, all items are welcome as a greater selection allows us to accommodate different dietary needs and cultural preferences.
