THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ. At the invitation of the bishops of the United States, we are embarking upon a time of Eucharistic Revival. Here at St. Paul's, and as a nation, we will continue to draw close to the Lord in His Eucharistic Presence, and will pray, study and worship as a community. Today's feast is a great opportunity to explore the Catechism for its insights about the doctrine of the Eucharist; to become familiar with the saints for whom this mystery was a defining reality in their lives; to read the Sacred Scriptures which reveal this mystery; and, to read (and sing!) the magnificent hymns associated with this feast (especially those by St. Thomas Aquinas.) In celebration of this gift from the Lord, we will have a simple Eucharistic procession within the Church at the conclusion of the 11:00am Mass.

This is the final week for our choirs to sing before their summer hiatus. How blessed we are to have fine music so central to our worship! I want to thank the music leaders, singers, and organists for their commitment and sharing of talents.

I want to thank the parishioners who have donated the funds for an industrial refrigerator for our Food Pantry, allowing us to provide for even more needs. The Food Pantry serves almost a hundred people each Saturday, staffed by very generous volunteers. Your support with items for distribution, noted in this bulletin, is most welcome.

I hope that you are enjoying the four new planters and bench in front of the church! This beautification project is funded by the Inspiring Hope campaign. You also may have seen one of the damaged cement pilasters in that area; unfortunately, this was a deliberate action taken during the Satancom weekend at the end of April. Repairs will take place this summer.

I continue to remind folks about the regular but simple ways you can be part of parish life: have Mass offered for loved ones and special intentions; sponsor the Vigil Candle that stands next to the tabernacle, alerting people to Jesus' Eucharistic presence there. Also, with summer on the way, we are always looking for help with lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, and in a pressing way, for ushers.

Let me welcome new parishioners who are with us at St. Paul's. Whether this is a longer stay, or you are here for the summer for study, an internship, or other purpose, we are happy to have you here. Please see our website for summer activities or speak with any of the priests. You are also encouraged to serve, even for a short time, as lector, altar server, Eucharistic Minister, usher, outreach to those in need...we have many opportunities here!

Finally, I want to congratulate the nine students who will graduate from St. Paul's Choir School this Thursday at 6:00pm in the church. All are welcome to join the celebration. They and their families have been a very significant part of our life at the school, and we offer our thanks to them as they begin the next part of their education and journey in High School.

FOOD PANTRY

As the extra benefits that helped families through the pandemic come to an end, the number of people visiting the food pantry each week is increasing. In fact, we plan to shorten our hours because we are routinely running out of fresh produce and other perishable items after the first hour. If you would like to help keep our shelves stocked, we need boxed shelf-stable milk (both dairy and non-dairy alternatives), pasta sauce, peanut butter, jelly/jam, canned and dried fruit, nuts, crackers, granola bars, rice, solid white tuna, tea, and coffee. Guests select only two items from the pantry each week so we know that donations from parishioners go to individuals and families who will use them. The paper grocery bags that we receive from parishioners also help tremendously as we need about 100 bags every week and they are too expensive to purchase.


