FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

We go in Sunday's Gospel from Luke beginning his Gospel (1:1-4) to Christ's beginning his Ministry in Nazareth (4: 14-21). Inside the sanctuary of St Paul's, the statue of Isaiah holds the very roll Christ read from and Christ's goals therein stand in contrast to what the World or Flesh or Devil prefer. His aims in life sound like Pope Francis' messages to remind us of those in need, at the periphery: glad tidings to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight to the blind and that the oppressed go free.

Just such a message was this year's March for Life in Washington: concern for the least and last among us, that we protect life from its beginning to its natural end. It was surprising finally to see the March properly photographed and featured on the front page of The New York Times. Along the same line, it was bittersweet (but so helpful) to see the Boston Globe's weekly feature, "Sunday's Child" with the photo and heartening description of a foster child desperately seeking adoption into a family, a home, and simply to be loved for themselves! I'm heartbroken to read it each week but pray that we never miss it and ever encourage adoption and praise too the caring of foster families!!)

This Friday, January 28th, is the 450th birthday of the woman who founded several families, Saint Jane Francis de Chantal. A universal patroness for women, whatever their situation, she was, by turns, single, married, widowed, and then living with a difficult father-in-law and his mistress - as she brought up her children, then a nun and foundress. She joined forces to found with St. Francis de Sales the Visitation order of nuns. By the time of her death there were 60 monasteries of Visitandine nuns.

These two great saints envisioned something new in the Church. If Women's orders had been cloistered behind walls and bars and their lives focused on extreme asceticism, St. Jane de Chantal and St. Francis de Sales innovated an order where the nuns would serve the sick and the poor in the cities; thus, the name "Visitation," honoring Our Lady's going forth to serve her cousin Elizabeth. "What do you want me to do?" she would ask. "I like sick people, I'm on their side."

Within a decade their vision was considered too radical and shut down. Yet the priest de Sales appointed as chaplain to the Paris Visitation, St Vincent de Paul, became in time the founder of the Daughters of Charity with their famed hospitals and orphanages and public charities for the sick and poor and indeed Jane's vision was allowed to triumph. May it ever triumph in us!
