Dear Friends,

Please join us for the Choir School Christmas concerts on December 10 and 17 at 3:00pm here in the church; they are a delightful part of the holiday season and critical fundraisers for our school. Bring many friends! Tickets are available on the school website, with general seating available at the door. Student tickets are only \$10.00!

Our Advent Luncheons for our homeless sisters and brothers have begun and will continue throughout Advent on Wednesdays following the noon Mass. You are welcome to volunteer financial support but especially time for setting up, serving food, cleaning up, and just sitting with our guests.

We also can help others in need through our Giving Tree, found in the church vestibule. Tags hanging there can be retrieved with gift item requests and information. Thank you for your participation. You will find Advent and Christmas schedules of Masses and events in the vestibule and on the parish website. Be sure to check it out.

I was sorry to share last week that the boiler which heats the Parish Offices, Choir School, Harvard Catholic Center and rectory has breathed its last! How cliché! This was an unexpected blow. There are solutions for some heat in various parts of the building, though there is none in the rectory; we will make other plans for living arrangements as needed. The estimate for the new boiler is \$150,000, which we hope to have in place by the end of December/January. You may remember that we recently replaced a pipe in the church at the cost of \$60,000. These numbers are staggering but very real.

With that, parishioners have asked about the Parish Grand Annual collection. We have had a modest beginning, with 29 pledges received. Could you help us to meet our goal of 400 parishioners participating? For our parish to stay solvent and afloat (not including these recent extraordinary costs), I am asking every individual or household to pledge/donate \$400; this can be paid in installments over the next four or five months. 400 participants/\$400. Please make the sacrificial offering that most reflects your ability. This, along with your weekly offertory, will allow us to carry out our important mission of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ here in Boston and internationally. Many thanks! See the website or call the office for more information.

During these Advent preparation times, if I could remind all of us to take a few moments of extra prayer each day. Our church is open from 7:30am to 6:00pm each day. The Rosary is literally at our fingertips. Advent wreaths and Advent calendars help us to focus. Confessions are each Saturday from 3:00-4:30, with a special session on Wednesday, December 20 from 6:30-8:00pm. The Christmas Mass schedule is complicated this year, so plan ahead!
