We are very happy to welcome Fr. Jean Sassou of the Diocese of Garoua in northern Cameroon. Fr. Sassou is here this weekend preaching on behalf of the Propagation of the Faith. I know you will welcome him warmly and offer your support at the second collection.

As we do each summer, we are tackling some maintenance issues. We have re-painted DiGiovanni Hall, and it looks great; not too much changed but in much better shape to host the myriad activities there. With the 100th anniversary of the church building just around the corner in 2023, there are a few other projects. First, we are about to begin Phase Two of the repairs of the wall around the rose window above the organ; it should be completed by the end of the summer. We have also begun repainting all the trim on the exterior of the church. This is both to improve the appearance, but also to protect the wood from the effects of sun, snow, ice and rain, our great friends of New England weather!! Finally, we are looking into adding more flowers and decorative elements to our property. We have so many faithful parishioners and visitors who come regularly to St. Paul's, and this is another way to enhance the experience of the beauty of our church and life together. The bulk of the cost for these improvements is being carried by funds from our *Inspiring Hope* Campaign from several years ago. If you were not part of that campaign or would like to contribute to this important work to our physical plant, I would be happy to speak with you!

Committees of many types have been meeting over these past weeks, covering topics regarding parish sacraments, communication, social gatherings and much more. We should all be very grateful to those who step forward to help us to grow in our relationship with Jesus and one another.

PROPAGATION OF THE FAITH: MISSION APPEAL FOR THE ARCHDIOCESE OF GAROUA, CAMEROON

Second Collection This Weekend!

The Archdiocese of Garoua is situated in the north of Cameroon, which happened to be the least educated and less developed part of the country. In the bid to fight ignorance, unemployment, immoralities, street children phenomenon and poverty, the archdiocese of Garoua founded St Andrew's school in 2012 with its first classrooms made of straw. With the help of people of good will, we were able to put up a building of 4 classrooms. Now with more than 400 students, there is insufficiency of classrooms to accommodate all the students in order to properly educate them. The archdiocese of Garoua is a relatively young (just over 60 years old) and struggling diocese. Despite our good will and efforts, we are not able to build the school alone; that is why we have recourse to you our brothers and sisters of Saint Paul's parish, Cambridge, inviting you to extend your love and compassion to your brothers and sisters of that far away part of the world. The proceeds of the appeal will be to build one or two more classrooms to get those who still have classes under trees and straw classrooms to be sheltered in sturdy classrooms. We rely on your generosity. God bless and reward you abundantly.

We frequently give out frozen chicken, pork, and seafood from our food rescue partners so people are grateful when we have sauces or seasonings to cook their meat. Our guests have been amazed to learn how responsive the parish has been to our requests for specific items.


