## SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

**Last week's version of my bulletin letter hit a speed bump and so never made it here in its printed form, so much of this will be familiar to those who did look online.**

**We are very happy to have our choirs back up, running, and singing!!** We are grateful to them for their perseverance and creativity in these days. Last weekend, we had a second collection for the Choir School, but because of a small glitch it was not taken up at every Mass. If you would like to contribute to the support of this incredible institution, you are encouraged to do so at any time. (And please check out their website for information about upcoming Open Houses and the Annual Gala on March 19!) Raffle tickets for fun prizes are also available after many Masses over the next few weeks to help the school.

Just before Covid struck, a dedicated team of parishioners joined in the process of preparing a **Parish Pastoral Plan**, with assistance from many offices in the Archdiocese. Like everything else, the work was put on hold, but I am happy to announce we are moving forward. We had a good meeting of Committee chairs this week, and we are making this plan a roadmap for the St. Paul's community as we move onward and upward. I am grateful to all committee heads and to Bridget Maricich, who is serving as facilitator for this important adventure. This will involve all of us, so look for updates and invitations to be part of it!

Thanks to all who led and participated in the **Parish Baby Shower**, providing needed supplies to the Office for Life in the Archdiocese. We look forward to our ongoing relationship with them. I would also invite you to take home some of the materials that are available to you in the church foyer; we will be putting them away after this week's Masses.

**On the financial front:** this weekend we are taking up an extra collection to help with "**Winter Woes!**" The recent snowy weekends brought down the Offertory taken at Mass by 65%. That, coupled with the cost of snow removal, has severely impacted our resources. Thanks for your help, and for using the automatic Electronic Giving option for the parish. You will also see information about the upcoming **Catholic Appeal**. This important fund supports the work of Cardinal Seán and the diocesan administration, which serves the parish, the Choir School and the Harvard Catholic Center well. We are looking for many first-time donors, as well as the committed support of those who have donated in the past. More to come!

We will soon be publishing our schedule for Lent, which begins on **Ash Wednesday, March 2**. You could put in your calendar now the **Vespers Service** (preceded by a lecture) on **Sunday afternoon, March 6**, and the **Lenten Evening of Recollection** on **Thursday, March 24**, featuring a guest speaker offering a brief meditation and a performance of the magnificent Pergolesi *Stabat Mater* by our Choir School. This begins at **5:30pm**. It will be a great occasion to which many should be invited and will also be followed by an Open House at the school.

**We are also monitoring closely the changing expectations for Covid related restrictions.** We are very much looking forward to these, and we ask your patience and understanding as new procedures are clarified and implemented in their proper time. It is often too slow for some and too fast for others, so let us care well for one another's sensitivities and needs. God bless, Fr. Kelly
