## EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

**At the time of this writing, we are still waiting to hear from the City of Cambridge about mask mandates. The Archdiocese has said masks are no longer required as of February 28 but has asked that we respect the practice of the city in which our church is located.** We are very much looking forward to these changes, and we ask your patience and understanding as new procedures are clarified and implemented in their proper time. It is often too slow for some and too fast for others, so let us care well for one another's sensitivities and needs.

Though we may have only recently removed all the poinsettias from our sanctuary, **this Wednesday we begin the holy season of Lent. Ash Wednesday is this week, March 2.** We will have **Mass at 8:00am, 12:10pm, and 7:00pm**, at which time ashes will be distributed. Please see the flyer which details the many ways we will be celebrating Lent here at St. Paul's. It is always good to take a little time before the season begins to ask the Lord what Lenten practices might best bring you closer to Him as you prepare for Holy Week and Easter. Let me highlight the special Vespers Service (and lecture) next Sunday, March 6; the Evening of Recollection with the Pergolesi *Stabat Mater* on Thursday, March 24, as well as Stations of the Cross, All-Night Adoration, extra confessions, daily Mass, etc.... "Come return to the Lord with your whole heart!"

**Next weekend, you will be hearing about the Catholic Appeal.** This is a diocese-wide collection that supports the administrative functions under Cardinal Seán's leadership. I had a conversation with a parishioner last week which made me realize how little folks may know about the many services we receive from the Archdiocese. At least weekly, and often more, we receive invaluable hands-on advice and practical assistance from the central administration Finance Department, the Risk Management Department, legal support, Human Resource support, Catholic Schools support, Canonical assistance, College Chaplaincy support, ongoing support for priests and deacons, CORI form processing, skill improvement workshops for many ministries, etc... It is an outdated perception that the archdiocese takes without giving; I can assure you of that. *We are looking for many first-time donors, as well as the committed support of those who have donated in the past.* The weekend of March 12 and 13, we will take a few moments during Mass for an in-pew filling out of Pledge cards. Please give prayerful consideration to what you can give. Perhaps watching the Cardinal's video on our website will be helpful. And when we reach our goal of \$83,000.00, any donations after that come back to the parish.

Remember, ours is a Church of feasting and fasting, so enjoy Mardi Gras!!

FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry was recently blessed with a large donation of nonperishable items from the annual Many Helping Hands 365 MLK Day food drive. Commonly donated items such as canned beans and vegetables are now in abundant supply. Items that are popular but missing from the shelves include juice (bottles of 100% juice - apple, cranberry, or blended varieties), nuts, dried fruit, fruit cups, soft breakfast squares or bars, pancake mix, and maple syrup. Other current needs include coffee, pasta sauce, rice, and salad dressing. Clean, intact paper and plastic grocery bags are always welcome as well.
