We can all pray for our Choir School students who will be in Washington DC for five days this week. (They will not be singing here on the 22nd.) They have been invited to the capital to sing at one of the Pro-Life Masses; and along with that, they have several other singing engagements. Also, our Eighth Grade students will make an extended visit to celebrate their final semester here.

On **Monday, January 16**, our nation celebrates Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day. I had the opportunity to see the new sculpture park dedicated to him and his wife on Boston Common. It is an important addition to this historic space. In recognition of the holiday, our parish offices will be closed and there will be one Mass at 9:00. I hope you can join us.

On **Friday, January 20**, we will have our annual Holy Hour for Life. Deacon Tim will preside and will offer the homily at the 12:10 Mass which follows Adoration and Benediction. Please join us for this vital prayer intention.

Looking ahead to **Wednesday, January 25**, we will celebrate the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul, our patron. As a simple way to observe the day, we invite you to come to the 12:10 Mass, with music provided by our Choir Boys. Then following, we will have a simple luncheon in DiGiovanni Hall. You are most welcome and encouraged to come!
