We also want to remind anyone who is struggling to afford healthy food that we are open to everyone in need. There is no paperwork required, but we really enjoy getting to know people. For some, the connection is as important as the bag of food they receive. Currently, the most **urgent needs** are **crackers, shelf stable milk, and jelly or jam**. **Snacks like dried fruit, trail mix, fruit cups, and nuts** are also in limited supply.
