SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends and Parishioners,

As each of us priests rotate taking a couple weeks away, I'm now back and immersed in planning for the Fall.

We've decided to combine our RCIA and Adult Confirmation programs in order to maximize resources and volunteer capacity. Plus, many Catholic college students and adults who seek confirmation are doing so because of a recent moral or spiritual conversion. So in the deeper sense of the word, everyone in the program will hopefully undergo interior conversion.

I'm also happy to announce that we will be running "Alpha" for college and graduate students in the fall. Alpha is a famous evangelical program that began several decades ago at Oxford. It has since acquired a Catholic branch and is making inroads in the campus ministry world. With a special emphasis on hospitality, Alpha seeks to offer a "big picture" presentation of the Gospel where people are encouraged to freely express all of their pressing questions about the meaning of life, God, and the Church. The program is less about giving quick answers, and more about providing a space that elicits deeper questions. My main target for Alpha here will be non-Christian and fallen-away Catholic students at Harvard who have some level of curiosity about the faith, but are not yet ready for RCIA or even a Bible study. Once students arrive in September, you will be hearing more announcements about it. But if you know anyone who fits this target audience, please remember to send them to us on Tuesday evenings starting September 19! We are grateful for the grant from Alpha that is making this possible, and includes funding for the 2nd floor classroom renovations. If the program is a success, we will look into running it for non-students in the future.

Let's not forget that whether it be to join us for Mass, Alpha, RCIA, Adult Confirmation, or any parish activity, every Christian has a solemn duty to invite others into a deeper relationship with Christ and His Church... and is given the grace of the Holy Spirit to do it! If everyone reading this brought just one new person to the Church each year, we'd be full beyond capacity in no time.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love.
