**Eric Jacobsen, Sheldon Amory Professor of Organic Chemistry** and former Chair of the Department of Chemistry and Chemical Biology, discusses how Catholic faith has influenced his life choices, fields of research, teaching, and interactions with colleagues and students. #### FOOD PANTRY

As we begin Lent, parishioners may want to donate to the food pantry as part of your almsgiving. While our shelves are overflowing with pasta and canned beans, other items are in high demand. Now that our inexpensive source of shelf stable milk is no longer available, we have an **urgent need for quart-size containers of milk (Parmalat, Natrel, or similar)**. Other items that would be particularly helpful at this time include **canned peaches and pears, coffee, mayonnaise, jelly, salad dressing, crackers, granola bars/cereal bars, peanuts, canisters of plain oatmeal, cooking oil, and flour**. However, all items are welcome as a greater selection allows us to accommodate different dietary needs and cultural preferences.


