THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I am happy to share with you the second and final installment of my fall bulletin update. So much has been happening here that it almost feels like "normal" again!

Thank you for your prayers for undergraduate retreat two weeks ago; each of the 35 students had a transformative experience as we deepened our understanding of the Holy Trinity, its indwelling in our hearts, and our confidence in proclaiming the Resurrection of the Lord. With typical Dominican theological elegance, Fr. James Brent OP began the retreat on Friday with the thesis that the full meaning of each of our lives resides within the Holy Trinity. He guided us through a meditation on the famous Rublev icon of the Holy Trinity to help unpack such a lofty mystery. And then on Saturday he "cut to the heart," as it were, by explaining how we have to cut through all the false identities of the world that often clutter and surround our hearts in order to unveil the indwelling of God at the deepest level. And finally on Sunday he tied in some of his own personal journey of conversion and of navigating through philosophical studies in an environment openly hostile to Christianity (prior to his entrance into the Dominicans). It gave students a great sense of confidence and freedom in not being afraid to proclaim that Christ is truly risen; not as an article of divinely-revealed truth (like the Trinity), but as a completely rational, historical fact! The highlight for me personally was seeing all of the students commit to an hour of adoration on Saturday night, from 11:00pm to 8:00am.

From all accounts, Fr. Hehir's 2nd talk on Sunday was a great success, and thankfully we were able to work out all the kinks in our video streaming system in the church so that many were able to watch it remotely. For those who missed it, both talks are available for viewing anytime on our *St. Paul's Harvard Square* YouTube channel. Thank you to our Social Justice Committee and to all who helped make it a success.

As we now find ourselves in November, the month of the Holy Souls, I invite everyone to commit some extra time for praying for the dead. From the Church's official book of indulgences: "A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted to the faithful who, on any and each day from November 1 to 8, devoutly visit a cemetery and pray, if only mentally, for the departed." Furthermore, a partial indulgences can be gained year round for a soul in purgatory by visiting a cemetery and praying for the dead. The traditional prayer is perfect for any occasion, even as a tag on the end to grace before meals: *Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them.*

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.
