THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear Friends,

Forward in Faith: isn't that a good motto for Lent, and in fact, for our lives? This is the theme for the 2024 Catholic Appeal, the collection which allows Cardinal Seán to fund the pastoral outreach that is done throughout the archdiocese every day, as well as the administrative offices which make that outreach possible. I can assure you that our staff also reaches out to the central offices frequently for assistance with our parish ministries. Our goal for this year as a parish is \$99,000. When we reach that number, a portion is returned to us for our own use. This is likely Cardinal Seán's final year overseeing this collection as he intends to retire this Spring (at age 80, I think it is only fair!); it would be a wonderful expression of gratitude to him if we could reach our goal. As we have done in years past, next week I will lead all the parishioners during the Masses as we each fill out a pledge card. Please give ample time and prayer this week to decide what you will be able to give; if it helps your discernment at all, I personally have pledged \$450 this year. Thank you!

We have two priests for **confessions on Saturdays from 3:00-4:30** and have added an extra slot on **Wednesdays from 6:30-8:00**. Confession, regular attendance at Mass (daily, if possible!), time before the Blessed Sacrament, Stations of the Cross, daily reading of Scripture and acts of outreach and charity, shaped by prayer, fasting and almsgiving are all tried and true means for preparing ourselves to return with great love to the Lord.

I'd like to highlight two calendar items. On **Thursday, March 7** at 4:30, the Harvard Catholic Forum is hosting a lecture on the place of settings of Psalm 51 in the history of sacred music. This is followed at 5:30 by a musical presentation by the St. Paul's Choir of Boys and Schola of various *Miserere* settings. All will be in the church. See the Forum website for more information. Then, on **Saturday, March 16** at 6:00, we will have a whole community celebration not unlike our Oktoberfest. "Gaelic and Garlic" commemorates the Feast of St. Patrick and St. Joseph, Irish and Italian. If you would like to help with food, set up, decorations, entertainment, etc., please contact Anneliese at her RCIA address or Nancy in the office, and she will send you in the right direction. Save the Date!!

We have only just received an invitation for another conversation regarding the Synod on Synodality. This will be hosted by Bishop Barbosa next Saturday, March 9 from 10:30 AM to Noon at St. Mary of the Annunciation Parish in Cambridge. There is ample parking there. If you plan to attend, you could let Nancy in the office here know.

Please pray for our High School Confirmation students who are on a retreat day Sunday. They are an inquisitive and lively group whose commitment to the faith is refreshingly alive!


