FOOD PANTRY

Although many people associate food pantries with pasta and canned goods, we are blessed to have so much more to offer. Our food rescue partners provide meat, eggs, cheese, prepared meals, and some unique items like blueberry lavender flavored milk. We rely on parishioners to help keep the pantry itself stocked. There are a few items where the demand often exceeds the supply, most notably **coffee and crackers**. In addition, we need quarts of **boxed milk, jam or jelly, canisters of plain oatmeal, solid white tuna, canned and dried fruit, honey, and condiments**.

Low gluten hosts are available. Please speak to one of the priests, in the sacristy, before Mass if you require one.
