FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners and Friends in Christ,

We rejoice and give thanks to Almighty God for the recent Supreme Court decision released on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, overturning Roe vs. Wade and thus handing the question of abortion down to the states. Hundreds of thousands, if not millions, of innocent lives will now be saved each year.

While the issue of abortion is in one sense very simple from a moral standpoint, it is at the same time one with complex ramifications both for individual women and the body politic. The foundational principle of Catholic Social Teaching is the dignity of every human person created in the image and likeness of God, no matter the stage in life, sex, race, religion, intellectual capacity, or physical capability. It is for this reason that the Church teaches very clearly: "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person – among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life." (Catechism, 2270). We are further called to solidarity with those in need and to help order the structures in society toward supporting a culture of life, giving women the freedom to choose life.

Since the Dobbs decision in no way ends the broader abortion debate in society, it should serve as a reminder to all of us to work within our own particular spheres to help build up this culture of life and support the dignity of every person in all stages. The Church's teaching on abortion is one of particular sensitivity to women who have undergone one themselves. It is therefore imperative that we repeat without ceasing the Church's timeless message of mercy and hope. Here in the Archdiocese of Boston and throughout the country is a wonderful ministry for post-abortive women called Project Rachel. It offers confidential healing retreat days throughout the year, free of charge, led by extraordinary mentors, counselors and spiritual directors.

We must also stand up against the recent spate of violent attacks on Catholic churches and pregnancy care centers throughout the country. The latter do incredible work at offering assistance to women in need so that they feel free to choose life. All of it is done largely by volunteers and at a shoe-string budget.

While access to abortion will not be restricted in Massachusetts, it is necessary for each of us to be able to give public testimony to the Gospel of Life. Take the opportunity in the situations that will inevitably arise to share this message of hope, mercy, and freedom with your family, friends, and colleagues.

I invite you to also read Cardinal Seán O'Malley's statement. Hard copies are available in the church vestibule and can be found easily by searching online.
