## EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we are amid peak vacation season, we should be mindful of the deepest sense of the word "recreation," that is, to "re-create" our spirits so as to better love and serve the Lord. For many, slowing down and enjoying proper rest - most especially on the Sabbath - can be quite challenging. But as Our Lord says, "the Sabbath was made for man;" we therefore need to be able to rest with the Lord each week in order to anticipate that state of eternal rest in Him for which we hope. A good vacation should thus be considered an extended Sabbath!

The great 20th century philosopher, Josef Pieper, in one of his most popular works wrote about leisure being the basis of culture. Pieper connects leisure to the contemplative life, and it is contemplation that allows us to penetrate the mysteries hidden in God. He writes, "Leisure is a form of that stillness that is necessary preparation for accepting reality; only the person who is still can hear, and whoever is not still, cannot hear... Leisure is the disposition of receptive understanding, of contemplative beholding, and immersion - in the real."

And so I hope everyone can take time for proper leisure: time in which you can participate in the Father's ongoing work of creation and in the Holy Spirit's mission of recreating us in the image of the Son. All of this is so that you can be more deeply immersed in reality itself, and most importantly the invisible realities that we know by faith and contemplation.
