NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

This week, we celebrate the beautiful **Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. Every Holy Day offers us the opportunity to reflect on another mystery of the Christian life, strengthened by the Word and the Eucharist. **Masses will be on Tuesday, August 15 at 8:00am, 12:10pm, and 7:00pm.** We look forward to having you here with us.

I am delighted to announce that Bishop Robert Barron will be with us here at St. Paul's to celebrate the **11:00am Mass of the Holy Spirit on Sunday, September 17**, asking God's blessing on the academic year at Harvard University and St. Paul's Choir School. He will also deliver a lecture at Harvard that afternoon, sponsored by our own Harvard Catholic Forum. Bishop Barron is the founder of *Word on Fire* and an important voice internationally in the mission of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We hope that you can join us!

This coming Saturday night, August 19, we will be hosting a concert by *Ensemble Altera*, a distinguished vocal music group. They will have been recording a new album during the week, and the performance will be a sharing in the fruits of that labor. Tickets are available at the door or see the bulletin for details. It will be a wonderful way to spend an evening.

Speaking of music, there are a few items of note. First, we are excited to welcome our Interim Director of Music, Mr. Richard Webster, and Associate Director of Music, Mr. Brandon Straub. They are finding their footing and gearing up for the important ministry that music is here. We are also happy to "welcome back" to St. Paul's Mr. William Endicott. William is a graduate of the Choir School and Director of Music at Holy Name Parish in West Roxbury. He will be the new music leader for our 5:00pm Sunday Mass, a new initiative here to develop and elevate the level of music at that Mass for the enrichment of worship by the hundreds of students and others who regularly attend that liturgy. Welcome and many thanks to you all!

Another musical item: Mr. Richard Clark is the Director of music for our Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston and the Archdiocesan Director of Music. (He also has two sons here in the Choir School!!) Richard recently gave a lecture at a music conference which is available on YouTube. It is entitled: "Theodore Marier is the Most Important Liturgical Musician, Even Today." Theodore Marier, who died in 2001, is the founder of our St. Paul's Choir School and the general architect of our music program here at the parish. I hope you have a chance to seek it out.

I would encourage parents and guardians to register their children for Religious Education and for Confirmation. The earlier we have this information, the better prepared we can be! We have excellent programs here with dedicated directors, for which I am most grateful. We are also preparing for another great year for RCIA. If interested in becoming a Catholic, please see the bulletin notice. I would also like to invite families with younger children to consider our **Music Program August 21-25, hosted by our Choir School**. It is a good way to finish off the summer and to prepare gently for the upcoming school year.

FOOD PANTRY

People often ask if it is quieter at the food pantry over the summer, but the past several weeks have been particularly busy. Fortunately, we are blessed with deliveries of fresh produce from local farms and farmers markets during the summer. Two local food rescue organizations, Food for Free and Food Link, pick up food that might otherwise be thrown away and redirect it to organizations serving those in need. This includes cases of fresh fruits and vegetables, prepared foods from Whole Foods and Trader Joe's, and frozen meals created using extra food from college dining halls. Instead of sending them home with a bag of cans that they will never open, they choose two items from the pantry that they need. We are especially grateful to the parishioners who have been so generous in donating the pantry items that people commonly request. The items that we need currently are **canned fruit (peaches, pears, etc.), jelly or jam, rice, salad dressing, mayonnaise, crackers, nuts, trail mix, and coffee.**
