SIXTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

For those of you who I have not yet met, my name is Joseph Ferme. I am a seminarian for the Archdiocese of Boston assigned to St. Paul's this summer. I am currently in formation at the North American College in Rome and will be ordained a deacon this upcoming September in Rome.

Over the years I have found that a seminarian is often the object of much excitement when he begins his time at a parish. This, of course, isn't because of the man himself. I believe such excitement arises from the fact that for many he is a sign of hope. I am very grateful to be here at St. Paul's this summer and I hope that I can be a sign of hope for people, not because of anything that I say or do, but because of what God is doing in me as He brings me closer and closer every day to the priesthood.

When such excitement arises, I like to tell people that there are many good men in the seminary! I live with them, I know them, I pray with them, and I watch as God brings them, too, closer and closer to the priesthood. With that being said, I believe that there are men that God is calling to the priesthood *here* at St. Paul's, and men and women that He is calling to the religious life. And there is something that each of us can do about that.

All of us can continue to pray. Cardinal O'Malley likes to say that vocations are everybody's business. "Pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest" (Mt 9:38, RSVCE). Let each of us pray, then, asking God that young men and women would answer His call. Pray for those in particular who you think might be called, and pray in general for an abundant harvest.

Parents can encourage their children to be open to a religious vocation. In such a changing world, it can seem that only certain paths or careers can lead to success. But there is greatness in following the Lord's call, whatever that might be. Zechariah knew this to be true of his son, John the Baptist: "And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways, to give knowledge of salvation to his people in the forgiveness of their sins" (Lk 1:76-77).

Young men and women can be open to the Lord's will for them. As I said, I do believe that there are some people here in this parish, and likely some who will read these very words, who are being called to the priesthood and religious life. Be attentive to the desires that the Lord places on your hearts. Don't wait for some sign in the sky, but explore the possibility of a priestly or religious vocation and allow God to draw you by His grace. "Then I said, 'Lo, I come; in the roll of the book it is written of me; I delight to do thy will, O my God; thy law is within my heart'" (Ps 40:7-8).

Perhaps we will not see the fruit of such prayer for a number of years. Perhaps seeds will be nurtured here but will be fruitful elsewhere. In any case, we can pray with hope to "the Lord of the harvest." I am grateful to pray alongside you all in this endeavor.

UPGRADES TO CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM AND VIDEO CONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY

Over the past year, the clarity of spoken word through our sound system has unfortunately decreased due to two external factors. First, the refinishing of the plasterwork in the sanctuary added a full second (!) of reverb to the space. And second, some of the internal audio settings were thrown off for the sake of optimizing the audio for live-streaming during Holy Week, when many parishioners still remained at home. We would therefore like to invest in recalibrating the system and doing some minor upgrades. Most notably, the upgrades will involve replacing the 30+ year-old speakers in the sanctuary as well as in the choir loft. Doing this will allow for greater clarity without having to increase the volume, which results in feedback and the "boomy" cavernous effect. The main speakers throughout the nave still work well, but will be recalibrated in order to adapt to the increased reverb.

And finally, we hope to purchase a device that will allow for seamless video conferencing for groups in our Boles Conference Room. With this all-in-one camera, microphone and speaker that connect to the TV, meetings that include a hybrid of in-person and virtual attendance will be able to run much more smoothly.

The total cost for all of these upgrades is \$3,200. If you are interested in supporting this project financially, please contact Nancy in the Parish Office or speak to any of the priests.
