Dear Friends,

We are very happy to have our choirs back up, running, and singing!! We are grateful to them for their perseverance and creativity in these days. Last weekend, we had a second collection for the Choir School, but because of a small glitch it was not taken up at every Mass. If you would like to contribute to the support of this incredible institution, you are encouraged to do so at any time. Raffle tickets for fun prizes are also available after many Masses over the next few weeks to help the school.

Just before Covid struck, a dedicated team of parishioners joined in the process of preparing a **Parish Pastoral Plan**, with assistance from many offices in the Archdiocese. Like everything else, the work was put on hold, but I am happy to announce we are moving forward. We had a good meeting of Committee chairs this week, and we are making this plan a roadmap for the St. Paul's community as we move onward and upward. I am grateful to all committee heads and to Bridget Maricich, who is serving as facilitator for this important adventure. This will involve all of us, so look for updates and invitations to be part of it!

Thanks to all who led and participated in the **Parish Baby Shower**, providing needed supplies to the Office for Life in the Archdiocese. We look forward to our ongoing relationship with them. I would also invite you to take home some of the materials that are available to you in the church foyer; we will be putting them away after this week's Masses.

We began our **Adult Confirmation program last weekend**. There are limited classes, so this weekend would be the last opportunity for someone to join the program. I am grateful to Marianne Deramo who serves us so well here.

On the financial front: events like recent storms kept many away from being able to come to church (not to mention the ongoing impact of Covid.) For such reasons, if I could emphasize the importance of **Electronic Giving**, which is easily set up through our website, the kiosk in the vestibule, or using the cards provided in the pew racks. This ensures that all can support our mission here at St. Paul's on a regular, weekly basis, even if you are not able to be on the property for one reason or another. Thank you! Also, some have asked about assisting with the **Parish Grand Annual** that began in November. Yes, it is still ongoing until the end of February! Information is available in the foyer, or you could contact the parish office. Thank you for your support!

We will soon be publishing our schedule for Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. You could put in your calendar now the **Vespers Service** (preceded by a lecture) on **Sunday afternoon, March 6, and the Lenten Evening of Recollection on Thursday, March 24, featuring a guest speaker offering a brief meditation and a performance of the Pergolesi Stabat Mater by our Choir School. This begins at 5:30pm.** It will be a great occasion to which many should be invited and will be followed by an Open House for the school.

FOOD PANTRY

The food pantry was recently blessed with a large donation of nonperishable items from the annual Many Helping Hands 365 MLK Day food drive. Items that are popular but missing from the shelves include **juice (bottles of 100% juice - apple, cranberry, or blended varieties), nuts, dried fruit, fruit cups, soft breakfast squares or bars, pancake mix, and maple syrup.** Other current needs include **coffee, pasta sauce, rice, and salad dressing.** Clean, intact paper and plastic grocery bags are always welcome as well.
