Dear Friends,

This is Catholic Appeal Commitment weekend. This diocese-wide collection supports hundreds of thousands of people, agencies, and parishes in the Boston area, as well as the administrative functions under Cardinal Seán's leadership. Here at St. Paul's, we receive weekly invaluable hands-on advice and practical assistance from: the central administration Finance Department, the Risk Management Department, legal support, Human Resource support, Catholic Schools support, Canonical assistance, College Chaplaincy support, ongoing support for priests and deacons, CORI form processing, skills improvement workshops for many ministries, etc... It is an outdated perception that the archdiocese takes without giving; I can assure you of that. *We are looking for many first-time donors, as well as the committed support of those who have donated in the past.* We will take a few moments during the Masses this weekend, March 12 and 13, for an in-pew filling out of Pledge cards. When we reach our goal of \$83,000.00, any donations after that come back to the parish.

This weekend we also celebrate the Second Sunday of Lent. I would encourage you to join the many Lenten opportunities for prayer, learning, and service here at St. Paul's, which are outlined on the website and the flyer available in the church foyer. Let me highlight the 12:30pm Wednesday Community Luncheons for our homeless brothers and sisters, the *Evening of Recollection* with the Pergolesi *Stabat Mater* on Thursday, March 24, as well as Stations of the Cross, All-Night Adoration, extra confessions, daily Mass, and much more.

On the Covid front, we are very pleased that masks are no longer required in the church. I might also point out the return of our **Holy Water** fonts. Blessing oneself (or a place) with holy water procures Christ's saving action through the Church, reminds us of our Baptism, and in a very real way, strengthens us in body and soul. It also serves as protection against the Evil One.

**CORI RENEWAL TIME &  
PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN**

Per the Archdiocese of Boston, as part of serving in **ANY** ministry at St. Paul's, or any parish in the Archdiocese, Criminal Offender Record Information (CORI) checks are obtained for all volunteers who minister to or have the potential for unmonitored access to children, youth, elderly or the disabled. CORI checks with a valid ID will take place before you start practicing your ministry.
