## FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends,

**Happy Fourth of July everyone.** I hope that you can take a moment to enjoy the day and to thank Almighty God for the many freedoms we enjoy, and that we, as a nation, will turn more confidently to seek His care and protection. **Just a reminder that the daily Mass on Monday, July 5 will be at 9:00am in observance of the holiday.**

**People were very happy with the distribution of Holy Water bottles after Masses last week.** There are still some available in the vestibule, and they can be refilled by touching base with any of the staff here. I recommend having a little holy water font in your home, or to bless the rooms in your home from time to time. Springs of water, bless the Lord!!

**I want again to introduce to you and welcome Joe Ferme,** who will be with us for about six weeks this summer. Joe is a seminarian at my Alma Mater, The North American College in Rome. He will be entering Fourth Theology this year and will be ordained a deacon in October. He is a fine man, and we are very happy to have him here with us.

As mentioned last week, **I have decided that we will not be able to have Mass in DiGiovanni Hall this summer.** We will miss the comfort of air conditioning, but with all the moving parts involved with repair work after the Parish Center flood, we must have as much space as possible available to us as carpets, ceilings, kitchen, and walls are replaced. Thanks for your understanding.

**The repairs following the April flood have begun, with wall damage and painting being the first tasks on hand.** Plans for repairing the deterioration around the Rose Window in the church are being formulated. Also, please see Fr. Patrick's note about the proposed upgrade of the sound system in the church, and improvements to our Bishop Boles Conference Room which will allow us to have more efficient meetings as we return to a pre-Covid pace of life.

**We want to continue to swell the ranks of those who can help the parish as greeters, lectors, servers, and Eucharistic ministers.** We would also like to have a robust team set up to assist as **Offertory Collectors (ushers) for each Mass.** You could reach out to Deacon Tim, Judy Beatrice, or Nancy in the main office.

**We are very happy that Covid restrictions are being relaxed.** As announced, those who prefer to continue to wear masks are most welcome to do so. We will also continue to keep the two side sections of the church set up for distanced seating; all other seating is open now. Those who have received a vaccine no longer have to wear masks; others are asked to continue with this practice. For the time being we would prefer that people receive communion on the hand for the comfort of the Eucharistic Ministers; if you would like to receive on the tongue, please come at the end of the communion line. Registration for Masses is no longer necessary.

**We will be keeping the church open every day from 9:00am until about 7:00pm.** In normal times, we see about 50 visitors a day who come in to pray and to take in the beauty of this edifice. Pray that many will come closer to the Lord by their time, even if brief, at St. Paul's.

### **UPGRADES TO CHURCH SOUND SYSTEM AND VIDEO CONFERENCING TECHNOLOGY**

Over the past year, the clarity of spoken word through our sound system has unfortunately decreased due to two external factors. First, the refinishing of the plasterwork in the sanctuary added a full second (!) of reverb to the space. And second, some of the internal audio settings were thrown off for the sake of optimizing the audio for live-streaming during Holy Week, when many parishioners still remained at home. We would therefore like to invest in recalibrating the system and doing some minor upgrades. Most notably, the upgrades will involve replacing the 30+ year-old speakers in the sanctuary as well as in the choir loft. Doing this will allow for greater clarity without having to increase the volume, which results in feedback and the "boomy" cavernous effect. The main speakers throughout the nave still work well, but will be recalibrated in order to adapt to the increased reverb.

And finally, we hope to purchase a device that will allow for seamless video conferencing for groups in our Boles Conference Room. With this all-in-one camera, microphone and speaker that connect to the TV, meetings that include a hybrid of in-person and virtual attendance will be able to run much more smoothly.

**The total cost for all of these upgrades is \$3,200. If you are interested in supporting this project financially, please contact Nancy in the Parish Office or speak to any of the priests.
