Dear Friends,

A parishioner noted to me last week how blessed we are to have so much going on here at St. Paul's. Indeed! Be sure to see the website and bulletin for more details.

I would like to point out the meeting on Saturday, May 7 regarding the Synod on Synodality, which will be in DiGiovanni Hall from 9:30am (following Mass) until 11:30am. This will be a time for our community to participate in the process initiated by Pope Francis to invite the whole church to seek a deeper understanding of what it means to listen to one another and to the Holy Spirit as we follow the Lord. Two of our parishioners have attended information sessions offered through the Archdiocese of Boston and will guide the discussion. It's helpful to remember that this Synod and its various iterations is not meant to address issues per se, but the very act of listening. Certainly a worthy effort!

I would also ask you to join us for the Annual Spring Concert here at St. Paul's on Sunday, May 15 at 3:00pm, featuring music of Vivaldi, Mozart, and period instruments. This is a wonderful offering by our Choir of Men and Boys! It is a fine way to continue your Easter celebration and would also make a great Mother's Day gift (May 8). Be sure to invite others to join you as we show to the wider community the extraordinary way we serve as a center for sacred music.

### A MESSAGE FROM DEACON TIM

When Elke and I came back to St. Paul's three years ago and I was assigned here as a deacon, Fr. Kelly asked me to take on the role of Director of Parish Ministries to help him in supporting many of the ministries in liturgy, faith formation, spirituality, and charity that so enrich our vibrant parish. It has been a great blessing to labor in this vineyard with so many of you, both before and during the challenges of COVID.

Already during that first year, the Spirit prompted us to something new, building on our community's long engagement with Catholic thought and culture. The result has been the Harvard Catholic Forum ([www.harvardcatholicforum.org](http://www.harvardcatholicforum.org)). The Forum collaborates with the parish, the Catholic Center, and the Choir school by offering programs that deepen and extend our common commitment to Catholic life and evangelization. At this point, I find myself serving as the Forum's Program Director, overseeing a growing program of lectures and non-credit courses, with a small but dedicated staff, and now with three years of financial backing from the John Templeton Foundation.

In light of my heavy involvement with the Forum, and after prayerful discernment, I asked Fr. Kelly if I might be relieved of the position of Director of Parish Ministries with its administrative responsibilities, and he agreed. In the months to come, we will be exploring various possibilities to fill that important role. I remain the parish deacon, with the sacramental and pastoral roles that go with that assignment, and I look forward with hope and joy to serving this unique community in the years ahead.

#### INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

What prevents us from seeing the Lord? We are not used to seeing Jesus in the ordinary, everyday events of our lives. We expect some kind of startling, extraordinary revelation to occur that definitely and unmistakably sends a signal that God wants our attention. We don't expect a visit from Jesus while we are having breakfast, doing the dishes, running after the kids, negotiating a deal at work, or taking a shower! Sometimes when God simply stands on the shore of our lives casually looking for us, we don't recognize him. Did we ever stop and think that God is really and truly interested in the routine, run of the mill events of our lives? So, "what did you do today?" God may ask. Maybe we don't think that God is concerned about such things, or we are so consumed with life's demands that we give it little if any thought. Perhaps we are determined to achieve our own success, desire to control things ourselves or not really sure what God cares about. God is there. One day, out of the blue, God will get our attention and ask, "Do you love me?"
