THIRTY-FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Greetings Friends and Parishioners,

Another academic year brings another new beginning for the undergraduate community; a quarter of the members - last year's seniors - are no longer with us and a new crop of freshman have arrived. Thus the dynamic and "personality" of the community changes every year.

I'm still recovering from the usual sleep deprivation that marks our weekend retreats! We didn't wind down activities until midnight both Friday and Saturday nights, had an optional midnight holy hour the first night and all-night adoration the second. But as usual, it was a transformative experience for so many, including some for whom this was their deep dive into the Catholic life. The retreat was masterfully conducted by Fr. Michael Zimmerman, the Assistant Vocations Director for the Archdiocese of Boston, who took up the theme "Taste and See." In the Medieval tradition, each of the senses is associated with a theological virtue: hearing and seeing with faith, smelling with hope, touching and tasting with charity. The spiritual life and one's encounter with God can be described in this way, with the most important being taste, since it involves bringing an external object into our very bodies. This is just what happens with Christ in the Eucharist!

I'll use this opportunity to make a shameless plug for my podcast, "The Harvard Catholic." After a summer hiatus, I finally released a new episode. This one features two college students guest-hosting, interviewing me about priesthood and life at Harvard and St. Paul's. You might enjoy it! It can be accessed on all major podcasting listening apps and through our website.
