Dear Friends,

I plan to welcome new parishioners to St. Paul's at the beginning of my bulletin message for the next several weeks; it is such a unique and life-giving characteristic of our community, and we seem to be saying hello to dozens and dozens of new residents each day (not to mention our wonderful visitors.) I encourage you to see our updated websites for the parish, the Harvard Catholic Center, the Harvard Catholic Forum, and the St. Paul's Choir School. Please be sure to invite folks to St. Paul's who may be looking for a parish, a spiritual home, and a community.

I am delighted to announce that Bishop Robert Barron will be with us here at St. Paul's to celebrate the **11:00am Mass of the Holy Spirit on Sunday, September 17**, asking God's blessing on the academic year at Harvard University and St. Paul's Choir School. He will also deliver a lecture at memorial Church in Harvard Yard at 4:00pm Sunday afternoon, sponsored by our own Harvard Catholic Forum. Bishop Barron is the founder of *Word on Fire Ministries* and an important voice internationally in the mission of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We hope that you can join us!

The Choristers of our Choir School have a three-day boot camp this week. It will give them a chance to shake off the vocal cobwebs, to begin their formation under the care of our new music directors, and to prepare for the already full Fall season. (Hopefully Mother Nature has not taken a toll, sending us a lot of summer changed voices!!) This is a good reminder that if you know any boys from grades 3-8 who would benefit from our incredible school, with its music, faith, and classical education-based curriculum, it is not too late to apply. We often accept students newly arrived to the area. Be sure to pass the word. (The Choir of Men and Boys will begin singing again on September 10.)

I would encourage parents and guardians to register their children for Religious Education and for Confirmation. The earlier we have this information, the better prepared we can be! We have excellent programs here with dedicated directors, for which I am most grateful. We are also preparing for another great year for RCIA. Monday, August 28 is the Feast Day of St. Augustine, one of the great minds (and hearts!) of both the church and the western world. Take a minute to look up one or two of his writings and prayers!
